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Message from the CEO: Top 3 Accomplishments and Top 3 Goals

It has been a busy 2019, for sure. There are so many things to be proud of and grateful for but I am narrowing it down to three major accomplishments and three goals.

One of the things we are most proud of is the development of a small, plastic card designed to help teenagers who have friends contemplating suicide. We worked closely with RSU19 to create this tool that offers advice and resources.

Secondly, we were approved as one of only six sites, for a Clinical Trial Network Outpatient Based Opioid Treatment with telemedicine. This will help up us in our fight against substance use disorder.

Lastly, we received an Integrated Behavioral Health Service Supplemental funding award of \$167,000 to support our Substance Use Disorder and/or Mental Health Program. We are truly grateful because we applied for \$145,000 but were awarded an extra \$22,000 because of the good work we do.

Finalizing our School-Based Health Center in order to provide convenient health care to children right in the school.

Start the planning/building stage of a Wellness Center for the community to use and enjoy. We expect to have medical specialties, classes and more.

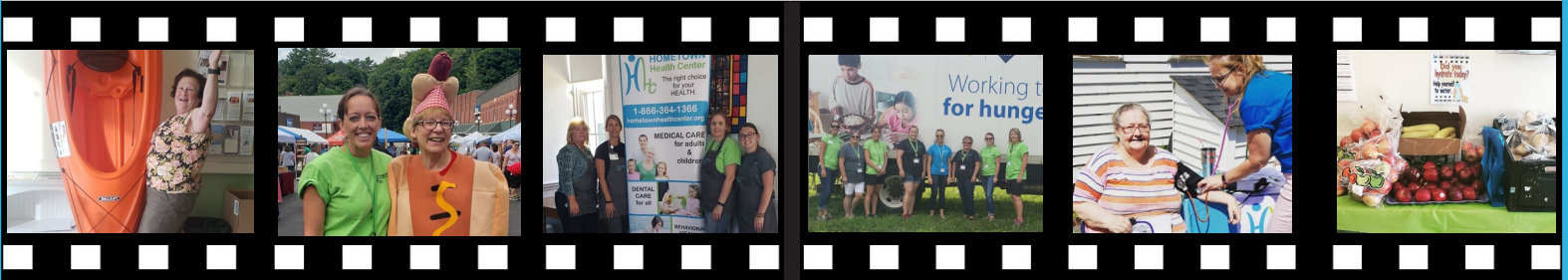
Full telemedicine implementation throughout HHC so we can reduce the barrier to care for more vulnerable populations.

Here's to another great year! We appreciate our patients, board of directors, staff, and community so much. It take all of us to remain successful and to live the mission of HOMETOWN Health Center.

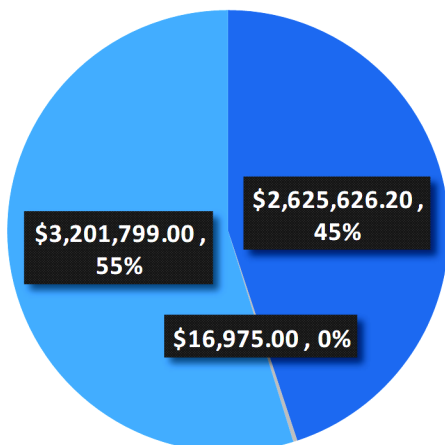

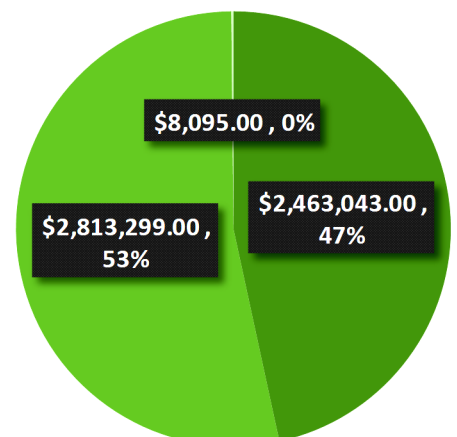

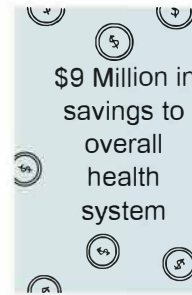
